Louisville Program

Thursday will start with two programs on "people management." Jasper will share a program they use that looks at management from the employee's perspective. That will be followed with an interactive program by Bill McKnight of Mahle Aftermarket called Values Voting. This program is designed to show how decisions we make at work are affected by our core values and personal biases. Bill promises this will be a fun exercise that will open more than a few eyes.

When these programs are wrapped up, the golfers will board a bus for an afternoon of great golfing at Fuzzy Zoeller's Covered Bridge Golf Club. Fred Calouette has outdone himself with this year's selection.

Jasper Continues to Expand

Jasper has announced plans to invest \$6.9 million to expand and relocate their transmission division. They will move it into a currently vacant 220,000 square foot facility ½ mile from their current 367,000 square foot facility at 815 Wernsing Road in Jasper. They are currently advertising for positions in manufacturing, maintenance, information technology, distribution, engineering and quality control positions.

LKQ signs letters of intent to acquire five companies in the Netherlands in another vertical integration as all five are currently customers. They expect to complete the transactions by the third quarter of 2014 which will add \$180 million of revenue.
